


# **Pre-Trip Information**

### WELCOME TO SAMARITAN'S PURSE U.S. DISASTER RELIFE PROJECTS

Thank you for partnering with Samaritan's Purse (SP) as we minister to families whose homes were damaged during Hurricane Harvey. Far beyond the physical help you will extend to the homeowners, the spiritual and emotional support you offer to them is even more important. We hope your volunteer experience is rewarding and life-changing. Harvey made landfall as a Category 4 Hurricane with sustained winds of 130 mph. Harvey remained a powerful storm and has brought torrential rain to Texas in the days that followed. Our response to this storm includes debris removal, roof tarping and mudouts.

In this document you will find Pre-Trip Information that will be valuable in preparing for and experiencing a fulfilling trip. Complete all Volunteer Forms online: Both adult and youth volunteers will need to take time to complete a series of online forms. Your team leader will send you a link, by email, to access these forms. Once your forms are completed, each volunteer will receive a confirmation/approval code email that should be printed and taken to the site. Once your forms are submitted, if you do not receive this email in 1-2 business days, please contact our office for assistance.

PLEASE NOTE: Email addresses are the unique identifier for each individual's volunteer account. Each volunteer will need to enter an email address that is not already in use by another volunteer/user. If you share an email address with someone who is already in the system, please create a new email address and complete your forms using that unique address. Failure to do so will result in overwriting the original volunteer's information. If you have any questions about this process, please contact our office.

- 1. Volunteer Criminal History: All overnight volunteers, over the age of 18, must undergo a Background Check before they volunteer; this is part of the online Volunteer Forms process. Volunteer applicants who have been convicted of crimes against minors or sexual offenses are prohibited from volunteering on any North American Ministry project. Other felony convictions that involve crimes against persons or crimes that, in the sole discretion of Samaritan's Purse, indicate the volunteer applicant is unsuited for this ministry opportunity will require a clean record for at least five (5) years after the conviction or release from prison, whichever is later. Samaritan's Purse reserves the right to restrict or deny volunteer opportunities to any applicant who Samaritan's Purse reasonably believes may jeopardize the safety and security of its volunteers, homeowners, partners or staff.
- 2. Youth Volunteers: Team members must be 14 years of age or older at the time they serve. If 14 or 15 years old, a parent/legal guardian/grandparent must work with the child on site (unless they are part of a Youth Group). Team members 16 or 17 years of age need either a parent/legal guardian/grandparent present or an assigned adult chaperone who is 21 years of age or older from their team (unless they are part of a Youth Group). Youth volunteers will also need to complete the following in addition to the online forms:
  - Youth Volunteer Release and Waiver of Liability: (All persons under 18) complete attached form and present it at check-in.
    - Parent signature is required.
    - o If the parent will not accompany the youth, the parent signature must be notarized.
  - Youth Covenant: (Youth Group Team Coordinator only) Complete attached form and present it at check-in. This form will also outline our Youth Group policy.

- Transportation: Volunteers must provide their own transportation. SP does not provide transportation to/from the airport; therefore, a rental vehicle is advised if flying to the location. Teams should be prepared to haul tools and a wheelbarrow.

  - **Safety:** Your safety is very important. Below are a few key things to keep in mind. SP Staff will also have an orientation and safety briefing with you soon after your arrival.
    - Know your limitations, take frequent breaks, and always remember to keep hydrated.
    - Be aware of your surroundings. Whenever off church property walk with a buddy or group.
    - Youth should never be left alone at a work site or be allowed to leave the site without parent/legal guardian/grandparent/chaperone/youth leader.
    - Adults must never be alone with an individual youth, unless the adult is a family member of the youth. This applies to all volunteers, SP staff, host church staff, host church members, homeowners, etc.
    - While on the worksites, please be sure to wear appropriate work clothes, work boots/shoes with thick soles, hat or cap, sun block and insect repellant.
    - Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) will be provided. Volunteers are expected to wear safety equipment as directed.
    - Each team member should be current on their Tetanus Vaccination.
    - Report all injuries immediately to the Team Leader and the Program Manager.
    - SP is not responsible for lost or stolen items. We ask that valuables be left at home and recommend that you do not store valuables in a parked vehicle.



### WHAT TO FXPFCT ON-SITE

🄯 Arrival: Please arrive by 9:00PM. If you plan to eat dinner with us, please let the site know prior to your arrival.

Parking: Parking is available for volunteer vehicles. Please inquire with the Volunteer Coordinator regarding space availability for trailers and RVs.

# Lodging/Meals:

Church: Please take off dirty work boots before entering the church buildings.

Sleeping Quarters: Volunteers are housed in a local church.

- Volunteers should bring a twin size air mattress/cot, as well a sleeping bag/bedding.
- Sleeping quarters are not the place for visiting.
- Common areas are available for socializing. A youth leader should be present in these areas when their youth are present.
- Lights out will be enforced.
- Male and female sleeping areas are separate. Males are not allowed to visit in the female sleeping area and vice versa.
- Do not leave any valuables in your rooms.

Showers: Showers are available in SP shower trailer.

- Volunteers should bring towels, hygiene items, and shower shoes.
- Please limit your shower time and make sure to secure the shower door when in use.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner will be served at the church. We will provide you with food to pack a bagged lunch to take to the worksite. Snacks will also be provided. Please note: We are not able to accommodate special dietary needs.

- Please be willing to assist with dining room clean-up, garbage collection, etc.
- Please wait until everyone has been served at mealtimes before going back for seconds.

Phone/Internet: Cell phones may be used to communicate while on worksite and with family. Wireless internet may be available.

Laundry: Volunteers will not have access to laundry facilities. Bring enough clothes for the duration of your stay.

# Worksite and Base-Camp:

While serving as a volunteer, you represent Samaritan's Purse and, more importantly, Jesus Christ. Therefore, the following policies apply. Please review this information.

Tools: SP provides all the tools needed for this site. Volunteers are required to wear appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

- Volunteers should bring work gloves, work boots and safety glasses. If serving at a flood response, please bring rubber boots.
- If you bring your own personal chainsaw, please bring your own PPE (including chaps, hard hat, eye and ear protection, and leather gloves).

Age Requirements: Youth are never permitted to work standing on a window sill, outdoor ladder, scaffolding or similar equipment, use power tools or machines (electric or gas), operate motor vehicles, be an outside helper on motor vehicles, or do any work on or about a roof.

- Youth Ages 14 & 15: Are allowed to participate in the following activities only: waterproofing foundations, cleaning and polishing equipment/vehicles, clearing lots, debris removal, painting, landscaping and site clean-up, gift bag preparation, folding t-shirts, restocking vehicles with t-shirts and Bibles, office clerical work, and other similar tasks.
- Youth Ages 16 & 17: Are permitted to participate in general construction tasks which may include working on a short ladder indoors.

Alcohol, Illegal Drugs & Tobacco: We ask that you do not use tobacco products (including e-cigarettes), alcohol, or drugs while serving with Samaritan's Purse. These products or their use are not permitted at the volunteer housing site, in Samaritan's Purse vehicles, or within the homes or neighborhoods of families being served by Samaritan's Purse. Those who cannot abide by this policy will be asked to leave.

Devotions / Share Time: Devotions are conducted every morning by staff or volunteers. Immediately following dinner volunteers will have the opportunity to share their day's experiences with the entire volunteer group during Share Time. You will have free time for the remainder of the evening. We encourage you to bring your Bibles. Journals will be provided. Attendance is required.

Language: Please do not use foul language or tell unclean jokes.

Animals: Accommodations will be made for ADA Service Animals, if possible. We are unable to accommodate pets or comfort animals that do not provide an ADA service. Please Note: Each project site will be evaluated for suitable and safe work for volunteers with service animals.

Photography: Taking photos at the job site is allowed as long as you obtain prior permission from the homeowner. Please remember this is their home and having sensitivity to what they are going through is of utmost importance.

Conflict Resolution: If you have a conflict with another team member, go directly to that team member or to your Team Leader to work things out. If you fail to resolve the issue, both parties and the Team Leader should to go to the Program Manager for guidance.

While serving at a project site, volunteers should wear appropriate clothing at the worksite and in the living quarters. Climates vary from site to site; therefore, you may want to check the weather forecast for the location where you are serving.

- Partial clothing when travelling from sleep areas, bathrooms, or showers (you should be fully dressed before exiting any of these areas)
