The Great Claim Came Before the Great Commandment

The Command: "Hello, my name is Private Joe Smith, US Army. I am commanding you all to risk your families, your reputations, and your very life by carrying out this mission I've thought up."

The Response: "Say what?! Who do you think you are? How do I know this mission has even been authorized? I wouldn't risk my pocket change following a command like that."

At least that's how I would respond. How about you? How can you follow someone with no authority to lead in the first place? Now let's go to the risen Jesus and the disciples on that mountain in Galilee. Not a word of scripture is a filler and God ordained each and every word for a reason. Jesus spoke these particular words before giving a command that seemed to be an impossible, enormous, even God-sized task, He said "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." In other words, "I'm in charge. I've got the power. I'm the commander-in-chief and everyone will know it. What I say, will come to pass." What a great claim! Jesus here tells His disciples that all of the power, glory and authority, which He limited Himself in using during His ministry on earth (Matthew 26:53), He is now unleashing. They can know that their orders come from on high and that the King Himself is behind their mission.

What soldier doesn't want to trust that his mission is authorized and that when he's in a bind the authority of his commander-in-chief is there to rescue him? At work who would want to invest themselves in a project that the boss hasn't authorized and committed to?

The Great Claim is the perfect opening to what we'll spend the next several weeks studying, the Great Commission. It is a call to battle that continues to reverberate through the ages and a claim that stands to this day, even "to the very end of the age."

"Why does Jesus make known this claim?

So that when He now commissions His apostles to proclaim the gospel throughout the world, they may know that moment by moment, day by day, they can lean on Him."
