### Nehemiah

In 586 BC, Nebucudenzar, king of Babylon, destroyed and burned down Jerusalem. While some exiles were allowed to return in 539 BC and partially rebuilt the temple, much of the city was still in ruins. Specifically, the walls of the city were all broken down, meaning the city was not a safe place to live. Now it is 444 BC. Nehemiah was a Jew and an official in the court of the king of Persia, the world power of the day. When he hears of the poor condition of Jerusalem, he comes up with a plan to do something. We pray this encourages you to move forward under the Lord's power to accomplish the missions He has for you.

### Malachi

A couple of decades after Nehemiah, somewhere between 420-400 BC, the city has been rebuilt, but the people's hearts are still far from the Lord. The people are going through the motions of following the Lord but doing it very half-heartedly and just giving God their leftovers. Malachi encourages the people to truly pursue the Lord because He is due something.

### James

The apostle Paul spent at least two years helping build up the church at Ephesus (see Acts 19). Now years later, he is a prisoner because he preached the Gospel, and he writes to encourage the church at Ephesus. In chapters 1-3, he talks about all God has done for us. Then in chapters 4-6, he talks about how we should live in response to what God has done for us (note that chapter 4 starts with the word "therefore").
