


### 1. Assess the Standard

Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you.

Matthew 7:2 ESV

Judge – To form a critical opinion of something (either positive or negative) by examination or scrutiny; The habit of sharp unjust criticism.



## 2. Assess the Self

Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

Matthew 7:3-5 ESV

Why do you pass judgment on your brother? ...For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God... So then each of us will give an account of himself to God.

# 3. Assess the Subject

Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs, lest they trample them underfoot and turn to attack you.

Matthew 7:6 ESV

# Big idea: do not give something valuable to those who cannot appreciate it.

Whoever corrects a scoffer gets himself abuse, and he who reproves a wicked man incurs injury. Do not reprove a scoffer, or he will hate you.

Proverbs 9:7-8 ESV


# 1. Handle All Situations With Humility

"God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

James 4:6 ESV



But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is only one lawgiver and judge, He who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?
