

Week 6 – Turn The Other Cheek

“You have heard that it was said, ‘An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’ But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also.

And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles.”

Matthew 5:38-41 ESV

1. An Eye For An Eye

“You have heard that it was said, ‘An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’”

Matthew 5:38 ESV

“The original law was a fair one; it kept people from forcing the offender to pay a greater price than the offense deserved. It also prevented people from taking personal revenge.”

The words eye for eye, and tooth for tooth come from several Old Testament passages (Ex. 21:24; Lev. 24:20; Deut. 19:21); they are called the **lex talionis**, the law of retaliation.

This law was given to protect the innocent and to make sure retaliation did not occur beyond the offense. Jesus pointed out, however, that while the rights of the innocent were protected by the Law, the righteous need not necessarily claim their rights.

2. Do Not Resist

But I say to you, do not resist the one who is evil.

Matthew 5:39 ESV

Resist – most translations, simply – do not resist.

To Match With; to come back at him in the same manner with which he is coming at you. The same level or in kind.



**Meaning – Stand against but not in same
way they're standing against you.**


3. Turn The Other Cheek

4. Let Him Have Your Cloak As Well

And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well.

Matthew 5:40 ESV

Tunic – Long sack-like inner garment made of cotton or linen. Even the poor typically had a change of tunic.


Cloak – A greater, blanket-like outer garment, worn as a robe by day and a blanket by night. Most would have only one of these.

If ever you take your neighbor's **cloak** in pledge, you shall return it to him before the sun goes down, for **that is his only covering**, and it is his cloak for his body; in what else shall he sleep?

And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles.


